This year's Midweek Lent theme is *Created for Community*. We will gather for Dinner Church on Wednesdays at 6:30 PM to explore ways we are in community with creation, the saints, our neighbors, those on the margins, and Christ. While the church usually focuses on individual acts of repentance, prayer, fasting, and sacrifice,

Lent is also a time to be in community with those around us. When we gather for worship, we gather "with the whole church." When we proclaim our faith, we

proclaim "with the whole church." When we pray the Lord's Prayer, we pray "with the whole church."

It was common in the early church to use the weeks leading up to Easter as a time where catechumens were trained. This training would be done by the whole community. The faith of both the catechumens and the entire community working with them was enriched.

This midweek series explores the faith taught to catechumens as an extension of the Sunday liturgy. It will dive deeper into the previous Sunday's reading from the Mark's gospel and invite us to reflect on exactly what it means to be in community and how that impacts our faith.

Please consider joining us for a time of worship, prayer, fellowship, and food as we explore our communal relationships.






#### New Year - 2024 STEPHEN MINISTER TRAINING

The first *Stephen Minister Training* class began Saturday, January 6<sup>th</sup>, from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. There are 5 attendees, which I am told by Stephen Ministries, is an excellent class size. We will be meeting one Saturday a month for an all day class training, covering 3 class modules each time. Most classes are in larger congregations which meet once a week, covering one module at a time. Our class opted for the once a month option, which is great for our size.

We have begun to knit together in study and fellowship for this important ministry and training. I hope to offer this training once a year beginning in January.


We are honored to be a part of this endeavor as we partner with the *Stephen Ministry.*

#### There are three ways to give when you're not in the sanctuary:

- To give online, simply go to our secure website and click "Donate" to set up an automatic donation plan.
- 2. Download the free Vanco Mobile app. Once it's downloaded, you can use our Invite code, 24A7NT to ensure you are linked to the correct church, and login with your current Vanco credentials (whether from the GivePlus app or our website's Donation page. If you do not have an account, you will be prompted to set one up. An even easier method of sending a single or recurring check donation to the church is by using Bill Pay with your bank or credit union online account or mobile app. Those payments are guaranteed and are shown in your bank or credit union records. Also, there is no fee to you or to the church.
